Rabbi Hillel Lavery-Yisraeli

Recently I happened to listen to a lecture about successful business leadership. There was a lot of emphasis on effective time management, which is definitely something they stress when training you for the rabbinate. This lecture said that one should have clear short-term and long-term goals in mind, towards which one should work. The successful leader, in the lecturer's eyes, avoids doing tasks of low priority which don't lead directly to the goal's fruition; those tasks should instead be deleted if possible, or delegated to "a person whose time is worth less than one's own," or, as a last resort, deferred until the highpriority tasks have been completed.

This notion that tasks of low importance should be delegated to people whose time is worth less than one's own was offensive to my Jewish sensibilities. Who are we to judge the value of someone else and

compare it to our own? As the Talmud says, "Who is to say that your blood is redder than theirs?" True, if there is a task which one person is uniquely qualified for and another task which requires less expertise, it would probably be the most effective to let the expert handle the complicated matter. But this must not be done with the condescending attitude of "their time is worth less than mine". Everyone's time and energy deserves respect. And we surely cannot decide on someone's value by the amount of zeros in their salary. The most important people in ensuring humanity's successful continued existence, after parents and rabbis, are school teachers. And we all know about the long, neverending hours teachers put in to their work beyond their classroom hours. Yet they are paid much less than so many less-essential professionals.

In the lecture, success was defined in terms of dollars and cents. They were, of course, talking about business success. There was another kind of success, far more important in my mind, that was being neglected: human success.

Judaism teaches us from the cradle to have a global outlook. We don't just measure worth in terms of dollars and cents. We constantly remind ourselves that we have to look out for everyone else, and that no matter where we work or for whom, we "answer to a Higher Authority" – our moral sensibility.

Remember the news item published a few months ago about the purse purchased at one of those megachains, that had a note hidden inside it from one of the horribly mistreated factory slaves being forced to produce that merchandise? The ease of information access available today allows us to know so much more about where our purchases are being sourced and to make appropriate ethical decisions. Most of us would prefer not to save a few cents when that is directly supporting a network of child slaves on the other side of the world. We don't want to buy clothes made by children for children.

Summer is the time when our calendar marks the destruction of our grand spiritual world of old, Temple-era Jerusalem, accompanied by the genocide and exile of our people by the Romans. Tradition tells us that our spiritual world was destroyed because of lack of care for people. Its our responsibility to rebuild our spiritual world through over-emphasizing concern for others. As summer allows us to enjoy more time with our families, we should think about the families on the other side of the globe, and remember that each action of ours has a global effect, whether beneficial or detrimental.

But let's conclude on a hopeful note. Remember way back when

people used to be able to bare skin and lie around to sunbathe, without having to worry about using sunblock? Many of you will remember what I do from when I was younger, when they announced (in 1985) that a horrific hole was developing in the ozone layer. This was directly linked to people's use of aerosol deodourant cans was directly involved in creating a horrifically dangerous hole in that ozone layer. We suddenly saw actual, physical evidence that a small action of mine here could have drastic measurable effects half way around the world! And yet, when that problem was identified, the world, perhaps surprisingly, reacted in a positive way. An international treaty was reached in 1986, at first greatly reducing, and later eliminated completely the production of CFCs. Today, all the countries in the world have signed that treaty! In 2003 scientists reported that the depletion of the ozone layer was slowing down, and just last year, in 2016, it was announced that actual healing was being noticed. It is estimated that the ozone layer will be back to 1980 levels in 30 or so

At Beth Jacob we offer both weekly classes, which focus on the understanding of Judaism, and experiential opportunities which focus on the doing of Judaism.

Our school meets on Wednesdays from 4:30 to 6:15 p.m. September through May. During this time, children from Kindergarten through Grade 8 learn with Morah Gila, Morah Margalit and Mrs. Fay Schmerling. Our curriculum's focus is on teaching our students to read and write Hebrew, understand and recite prayers, and about Jewish holidays and Jewish history, with a particular focus on the family histories of members of Hamilton's Jewish community. There will be more singing, dancing, crafting and baking. We will also have special guest teachers who will introduce us to new ideas and exciting new topics.

This past year, our students participated in multiple family-focused Shabbat morning services. From leading prayers to carrying the Torah, to preparing the weekly sermon, the students were the true leaders. We strive to

develop the children's independence, competence and confidence in their Jewish activity, not solely their understanding of it.

Next year's new offerings include an intensive Hebrew Language program, and a post-Bnai Mitzvah c volunteer opportunity program which will allow students experience volunteering with various organizations throughout Hamilton, both within and outside of our Jewish community. These hours can count towards the high school curricular requirement for community involvement.

Children who are not enrolled in our Hebrew school are welcome to attend Shabbat and Jewish holiday services and events.
