

a word from THE RABBI

We hadn't done it before, but last year we did. Though we build a sukkah every year, and eat in it each day, we hadn't slept in it until this past Sukkot. Select members of the family set up sleeping bags, excluding those of us who feared a return visit of the raccoon who joined us for dinner in the sukkah the previous year. A table was tipped onto its side to form a wall in what I figured was an impregnable anti-raccoon de-

fense. And so we slept under the stars, or what stars are visible from a Hamilton backyard, until morning came and the space was ceded back to the backyard critters.

I say this not only because I'm happy that Sukkot comes much earlier this year, meaning the chances for warm nights are better. I say this because the sine qua non of Jewish life is experience. It is never enough to sit back and let someone else do the Jewish-ing for you, it is always the act that matters. Hearing about the sukkah is no match for eating in one, eating in one is memorable, sleeping in one with or without the masked rodents of the night even more so. It is true with the tactile holidays, like Sukkot, the soulful ones, like Yom Kippur, and for the more cerebral ones, like Rosh Hashanah. Reading about teshuvah is not like actually repenting; intellectually knowing one should change one's ways is nothing like admitting it to others; sitting in a synagogue staring at your watch is nothing like feeling the prayerful music raise you while gnawing hunger keeps you grounded. Experience is the key.

This may seem obvious, but I'm afraid it's not. Sitting in place on the holidays is good — it's more than many Jews do — but a bit more investment brings greater return. North American Jewish adults are often embarrassed to use religious language or to engage in rituals without kids around, but it's not just kids stuff — most of this is designed for adults. And families with children often feel burdened by the many, many demands of taxing schedules, incessant deadlines, and commitments made elsewhere. But the commitment to a more whole experience of Jewish life can help center a family for the intensity of the rest of life. It does not come with learning about Judaism. It comes from immersive experiences.

We're restructuring our educational programs at Beth Jacob to reflect this, but, as the Yamim No'raim, the Days of Awe, roll around again, we are responsible both for the actions of our community and for ourselves as individuals. This is the time of year when we commit ourselves to new beginnings, to new ways of carrying ourselves, to creating a better self and better surroundings for that self. Sometimes, like on Sukkot, that means starting pretty low — but the sky's the limit. Are You Ready?

A word from THE PRESIDENT

Rosh Hashanah is only three days after Labour Day, but we're supposed to start preparing a month before the High Holidays officially arrive. (Personally, a phone call from a sister-in-law about meals or a frost warning are usually my first indicators that the Holidays are approaching.) We are encouraged to reflect on our lives, foster and repair relation-

ships and promise to do better, be kinder, more mindful. How can your shul help you to be ready?

At a recent gathering of our younger congregants, I stressed that the status quo has permission to go. Perceived boundaries which are holding back creative opportunities for their (or your) expression of Judaism are to be questioned. If we could have included a blank page on this bulletin, what would you add?

Fundamentally, our culture has taught us to be a second family for our congregants, a place where we can find the firm hand of support that we all need as we seek to repair and confront the challenges of our lives. The synagogue unfolds to us and presents its possibilities only when we make the effort to open it. When you enter Beth Jacob in 5774, let the new you resolve to make it the first of many trips throughout the coming year, a year of peace, renewal, health and happiness.

Join us on Friday, Sept. 27 as we recognize Hilton and Shirley Silberg with the honour of Chatan Torah and Amy Back with the honour of Kallat Bereshit



Since Hilton and Shirley Silberg moved to Hamilton more than 30 years ago from South Africa, they have made an enormous contribution to the Hamilton Jewish community and to Beth Jacob. Over the years they owned and operated a number of independent pharmacies in the Dundas and Hamilton areas, the latest being the DayNight Pharmacy chain. Since retiring from the pharmacy business in 2007 they have channeled their considerable talents and energies into their many volunteer interests. Hilton is a past president of JNF Hamilton and Hilton and Shirley were the joint 2009 Negev Dinner honourees. Active members of Beth Jacob Synagogue and the Board of Directors for many years, and, since becoming membership co-chairs in 2010, have warmly welcomed many new members to our shul. The Silbergs are leaving Hamilton this Fall and will be sorely missed. Beth Jacob is delighted to take this opportunity to recognize a wonderful couple with the honour of Chatan Torah.

Amy Back made her theatrical debut at Beth Jacob at the age of six, when she sang a duet with Johnny Levy. The play, Hans Chaim Anderson, was directed by her mother, the legendary Muriel Back. After many years of living in Boston, New York, and Miami, Amy moved back to Hamilton in 1997, and began attending services at Beth Jacob. Asked to organize a musical show in the same vein as her mother had done a generation earlier, Amy wrote and produced There's No Business Like Shul Business, a sold-out hit that brought out an enthusiastic crowd, the likes that had not been seen at Beth Jacob for some time. Amy believes that it was this particular show that led Wendy and John to realize that Beth Jacob could be vibrant and vital again, and marked the beginning of the revitalization of the shul. Amy's next project was to create a Purimspiel, that attracted the biggest Purim turnout in many years. Since then Amy has produced UJA Idol and UJA Cabaret, (both held at Beth Jacob) and a flash mob number for the Shul Within A Shul opening.

In Amy's own words: "I grew up at Beth Jacob, my parents both contributed their time and energy here, and I am very proud to follow in their footsteps," she said. "This honour has profound meaning to me, as the shul not only nurtures my spiritual side, but has helped me develop my love for theater and music, and created a new playwright." Beth Jacob is delighted to recognize Amy's contribution to the Beth Jacob community with the honour of Kallat Bereshit.


