Learn What You Live

Two young women visited the shul recently, neither of whom I had ever met before. They were sisters visiting, they said, the places where they had spent their youth (which really couldn't have been that long ago by anyone's counting, the oldest couldn't have been 25). They said they spent many hours at Beth Jacob, their parents dragged them frequently. Did it take? I asked. It did—they both are proudly Jewish, one has been living in Israel, and it all started within the humble walls of

Fay Schmerling's Hebrew School classroom.

I'd done the same thing to my kids last summer. We visited my boyhood synagogue in Kenosha, Wisconsin, and visited the Hebrew School rooms where my parents dragged me. Back then, I let them know in no uncertain terms that I would rather be somewhere, anywhere, else. But my parents (and, by extension, the community) said that learning how to be Jewish was important, no less important than sports practice, music lessons, or academic performance. I don't know how hard they thought about the message; I have the feeling it was more instinctual with them. But they got the point across: we don't want you just to know things, we don't want you just to do things, we want you to be something. A good person, a good citizen, a good Jew. Again, this wasn't the language used, but back at Beth Hillel Temple that's the message I got. I think, somehow, it's the message that the young women whose stroll down memory lane included the shul also got.

I say all of this because I can't tell this message to your kids with the same effectiveness that you can. I can help, but if we want our kids to care about Jewish life, and to know what they're caring about, an effort has to be made. It involves education, it involves parental priorities (namely, that learning how to be an individual who is confident and secure both in secular life and Jewish life is important, and that sacrificing one leaves us less complete), and it involves time. The time might be ensuring that you go to shul on Friday night no less than once a month, it might be Havdallah every Saturday night, it might be treating Jewish learning and activities as no less important than other family activities. It might be at home, it might be at Beth Jacob. If children never see a family member davening, or studying Torah, or engaging in Jewish activities as an adult, (i.e. not as part of a kids' program), a message is sent. To teach a value, families must live the value.

It might be an effort—an effort that didn't have to be made in an earlier age when social norms, ethnic identity, and the wisdom of the Jewish tradition was absorbed in a family's organic milieu. That culture is gone, and now we live in a more segmented culture where we must actively choose to place ourselves where our values are. It is not easy for busy families to do that. One must spend money and time in the effort. Believe me, I know the price tag for Jewish living is high. But having your twentysomething daughters stop by the shul when reviewing the meaningful places of their childhood? Priceless.

A NEW PROGRAM AT BETH JACOB

If you happen to pass the preschool room on Wednesdays or Thursdays, you may hear toddlers laughing, talking or singing. Nothing exceptional in that, you might think, except these are young children who are deaf or hard of hearing taking part in therapy sessions with their parents, helping them develop listening skills and spoken language.



The program is run by VOICE for Hearing Impaired Children, a nonprofit organization that provides support, advocacy, public education and therapy for children with hearing loss. Parents learn how to help their children to make sense of sound and techniques to encourage spoken language and literacy skills. As the children grow and are able to communicate, they can go to neighborhood schools with their siblings and peers. These youngsters have the same opportunities as their friends to hear stories, jokes, and music; to attend post-secondary institutions, become independent adults and achieve their full potential.

Cuts in Government grants meant VOICE was forced to give up its Hamilton location where in the past 18 years it offered therapy for between 10-20 families each week. It's wonderful that Beth Jacob has offered us a new venue to continue this crucial work and the children and families are really enjoying the welcoming and bright preschool room. Jewish Time

The short of it:

Early Kabbalat Shabbat!

Shabbat starts early in the winter, and so will we. Come early, come late, but come to welcome the Shabbat Bride! This winter, we won't wait to sing in Shabbat. Join us as we link our service to the heavens, starting near the time of sundown. 4:30 pm in December, 4:45 pm in January, 5:30 pm in February.

The long of it:

It's one degree below zero outside right now, but I'm not in a coat. That's because I'm inside, in a heated room. I'm a little tired because I was up late last night reading, though the reading light annoyed my trying-to-sleep wife.

The natural rhythms of life have been turned upside down by modern life: cheap, plentiful electricity allows us to keep our internal clocks independent of the sun (candles and gas lamps didn't have quite the same effect), and things like climate control, modern transportation, urban lifestyles, and fruit and veggies shipped from all over the globe in any season distances us from the natural world.

Jewish life seeks to help us re-connect. Through walking and unplugging on Shabbat, through a calendar linked to the sun and moon, and through days that start when the night begins. We are blessed to live in a time and place when we can act like we're far from nature. But it's good to recognize that we're smaller than nature.

So that's, for me, part of starting (and ending!) Shabbat on time. Shabbat doesn't start when I'm ready, or when it's convenient- it starts when the sun goes down. It is bigger than me, and it's good for me to get that I am not the measure of all things. So Shabbat starts and ends early in the winter, late in the summer, and suddenly, my urbanized internal clock is a tick closer to nature.

Mick Jagger said that time was on his side, and we're going to try and find out if it's on ours as well. There's value to linking Jewish practice with nature. See you early on Friday.

Why am I doing this?

What are we saying during services, and why are we saying it? Special explanatory services coming soon!

What to do and when to do it, what to say and when to say it, and more. We'll take our Shabbat morning service and insert commentary throughout, in order to explore the how-tos and why-fors of Jewish prayer. The siddur is not meant to be a mass of undifferentiated verbiage suffered through, but a prayerful experience we immerse in. Come early to hear the how and why.

Q: When?

A: **Shabbat morning, December 21 and January 18**

Q: Where?

A: **Richter Chapel, as part of the main service**

A: What?

A: **Explaining the prayers as we do them, to demystify the experience. And also to remystify it.**

Q: But won't that make services longer? My complaint is that I don't understand what's going on, not that it's, you know, too short.

A: **We'll skip the d'var Torah on those days. The explanations will be sprinkled throughout the service, so you have to come early to get the full experience. But we'll try to end on time.**

Q: Won't this disturb the usual rhythm of prayer?

A: It will. But I get the feeling that enough people would benefit from having a deeper knowledge of what's going on that it's worth a try.

Q: One last thing- if I actually show up, will all my prayers be answered?

A: **There's only one way to find out.**
