

Rabbi Dan Selsberg

ver my nine years here, I've spent a lot of time with some of you, a bit of time with others, and have had the opportunity over numerous holidays and hundreds of Shabbatot to develop some ideas about why, in world that would be barely recognizable to our ancestors, we are still called on to engage with our ancient tradition. Here, then, is my summary of three ideas that are at the heart of the covenant that is at the heart of our people's existence. These three ideas are responsibility, relationship, and hope.

"Life is God's call to responsibility." Rabbi Jonathan Sacks

Modern secular democracies speak of rights- the right to vote, the right of free speech, and the like- which is a great way to conceive of political life, but not for a spiritual life. Judaism is counter-cultural in that it focuses on responsibilities more than rights. Judaism asks us to be responsible for our lives, for the betterment of our communities, and for our part in bettering the world. We are not on the hook to do it all, but we are obligated to do what

we can. Our circumstances may be harder or easier, our abilities are different from one another, but our covenant with God commands us to stand as dignified partners in the bettering of God's world. We cry out not only for recognition of rights, but for the recognition of responsibilities. We don't have to be perfect, we don't have to be martyrs, but we do have to realize that we are called on to bring blessings into the world, and that responsibility, which first fell on Avraham Aveinu, four thousand years ago, is today ours— and our responsibilities are a blessing.

"Hillel said: If I am not for myself, who will be for me? And if I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?"
Mishnah Ayot 1:14

How we live in relation to others is a central question of our lives that Jewish thought never strays far from. How do we conduct ourselves vis-a-vis others? How selfish should we be? How do we create proper connections to God, to loved ones, to friends, or to people or animals we will never see? How should we live in connection to our environment? How can we feel a connection to our own needs and desires? How can we feel a connection to meaningful ideas and aspiration? The system of mitzvot, commandments, is designed to help us address these issues. Prayer can help connect us to ourselves, and to a sense of Godliness. Kashrut can connect us to a sense of the impact and meaning of our food choices. Shabbat

can help us plug into relationships and moods that are ignored when we are plugged in. Community life can connect us to people and ideas that challenge and expand us. Synagogue life connects us to practices that helped shape our people's lives for millennia, and allows future generations the same means of connection that shaped us and our ancestors.

"Know wisdom for yourself, if you find it, there is a future, and your hope will not be cut off." - Proverbs 24:14

We are commanded to rise to our responsibilities, commanded to build meaningful relationships, and we are also to live with a sense of hope. This is not to say we are to be naive, but we are to never stop dreaming of, and working for, a day that is better than today. Hope must inform our personal lives: we should never assume that, as individuals, we are incapable of positive growth. Hope must inform our relationships with others: outside of the most extreme circumstances, we do not assume that others are incapable of change or improvement. Judaism does not often counsel forgetting, but we often counsel forgiving. We also live with hope in a political sense: our prayers are a constant reminder that a just peace is our mission, and, in good times and bad, we do not abandon hope that the nations of the world, the State of Israel no exception, will know a future of greater justice and of peaceful coexistence. Hope is not about what is likely- we

know there are bad folks out there who wish us ill. Hope is about our attitude towards the world: not cynical, not pessimistic, not even realistic. We are the heirs of the prophets: we are to bring hope to the world; a vision that we are not condemned to an everdarker future. To the contrary: it may be a long wait, but we will help create a better world. And who knows? The wait may be shorter than you think.

These three ideas: responsibility, relationship, and hope, have been the themes I've returned to time and again here at Beth Jacob. Now that you have the summary, you can stop feeling guilty about missing all of those Shabbatot and go on to build a community and shul that reflects our highest aspirations. With Rabbi Hillel and Cantor Eyal, you have leadership that is perfectly suited to the task ahead. May you find blessings on the journey.

I hope to see you all at the various events planned in Karen's and my honour over the course of the next few weeks. If not, thank you for all of your help, understanding, and support since our arrival in 2006. The members, staff, and leadership at Beth Jacob have made Hamilton a true home for us for many years. We all have endeavoured together to build a better shul community, and have succeeded. We have done so because of how we responded to our responsibilities, our relationships, and by never losing our sense of hope. Through such actions, the work of our hands and the aspirations of our hearts will endure.

A Very Special Key

Change is all around us. Our membership will experience a significant change in rabbinic leadership this summer. And, as Rabbi Steven Wernick, CEO of the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism (USCJ)has pointed out, there is a huge paradigm shift in Judaism in North America; the way people relate to synagogue and Judaism has changed significantly.

While we look to our synagogues to address those needs, I invite everyone to examine themselves as well. With this in mind, I'd like to share with you a story that I wrote a few years ago. It's about tradition and heritage.

Young Daniel's father told him to clean his room. Daniel procrastinated. His father insisted and told him, "Anything you don't need, throw out. I'll help you." They started to go through Daniel's stuff. They found a few toys and a few little things here and there that Daniel no longer used very much and Daniel agreed to throw them out. Then, when Daniel was looking in his closet, he found a rusty key that looked a little ugly and clunky. He never used this key and couldn't even remember how he even got it. So he put it in the garbage pile.

His father quickly took it out of the garbage and told his son that he shouldn't have thrown it out. Daniel asked if the key was worth a lot of money. It wasn't. His father explained that he had given it to Daniel on the day that he was born. Daniel was moved and impressed. But did this mean that he had to keep every present his father had given him through the years?

"No, Daniel," said his father. "But let me tell you something. That key that you have in your hand, that I gave you when you were born, that key was given to me when I was born, from Zaidye. And do you know where he got it from? From his father, your greatgrandfather! But wait. Your great-grandfather got it from his father! And he got it from his father! And he got it from his father! And he

Daniel couldn't believe it! It was pretty incredible. The key had to be hundreds and hundreds of years old! And it had been kept in the family all these years!

Then his father asked, "Now that this key is yours, are you sure that you want to throw it out?" Daniel looked at the key and then looked up at his father, "Never. I'm going to keep this forever and ever and one day, I'm going to give it to my children."

Who can even begin to count the number of holidays in the Jewish calendar? Each and every holiday, festival or life cycle event demands special foods, prayers and rituals.

Each time we commemorate one of these times, we have an opportunity to learn more, teach more, remember fondly, feel thankful, and aspire to do better for ourselves and for our world. Beth Jacob is committed to sustaining our beloved traditions and providing access to everyone all year round regardless of cost, membership, religion, or age. Rabbi Dan and Karen have instilled a permanent message in our Beth Jacob psyche. We must use our physical, intellectual, moral and financial strength to help ourselves and our communities to live healthier, safer and

For anyone involved in providing meals to those in need in downtown Hamilton, joy smells like the onions, carrots, celery sautéing first for the soup. Joy is setting up chairs, coffee urns, shlepping groceries, flipping through the sale flyers, sweeping up, mopping, disinfecting, and mostly feeding and answering other needs of people who never get spoken to, smiled at, or served.

Our Tuesday OOTC group was welcomed in a new north-end neighbourhood by our wonderful hosts at St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church on Mulberry Street. Dinner attendance was slow at first but it gained momentum as the temperatures plunged!

We gained new guests' trust by providing delicious and plentiful food served by friendly people, many of who are teenagers. (It's particularly poignant that our actions, model that for our children!) Other comforts were addressed: socks, hats, scarves and gloves. Twice, we distributed bags of toiletries packaged by Beth Jacob's Hebrew school students and our special foods accompanying our celebrations of Chanukkah and Purim were especially appreciated! Hamantashen, brisket, latkes ... what's not to like?

One guest summed up our effort by saying, "Eating here is like coming to my dear old aunt's house." Knowing that most of our servers are Jewish, another guest always said, "Todah (thank you)" and "B'vakashah (you're welcome)." Another guest was overheard on his cell phone, "Second time this week I've had meatloaf." Well ... anyway you look at it, it's advertising, right?

The feedback, particularly from new guests, spurred us on month after month. On the last night, we hosted 123 guests. We're very grateful that everyone stayed safe and satisfied. Over 19 weeks, our 47 volunteers warmed, fed and kibitzed with 1607 guests.

For all those involved in OOTC, relationships were formed which further strengthen our commitment to one another and the obligation we so strongly have: to care for the needs of those who have challenges in their lives. Huge thanks to Norma Jack, our incredible Coordinator of Volunteers, Sister Nancy Sullivan and administrator Janice Ormond, the board of OOTC and all of you who contributed so joyfully and generously financially and with gifts in kind. Our 16th season begins November 6th!
