With important things at stake: market share, client loyalty, share prices, and the like—to just sail by crisis-to-crisis would be irresponsible. Companies care about making money, and they'll take time out to make sure it's done right and that it's done well.

This being a synagogue bulletin, you probably know that this isn't going to turn into an essay merely praising the wonderful financiers of Bay Street or the mentschen of Wall Street. I just want to highlight that when stopping to plan a way to get to a goal is important, you do it. We do it. That's part of the Season of Awe. We have to stop, think about our mission, and decide if we are going in the right direction, at the right speed, with proper care.

The High Holy Days are the staff retreat of the Jewish people. We step away from our jobs (yours truly excluded, naturally), and look at the big picture. What's your mission? Did you spend the last year moving in the right direction? Or not? How can you correct your course? What roadblocks can you anticipate in the coming year? Can you improve your performance?

Of course, the analogy doesn't work all the way—businesses hire and fire staff, while the supporting cast of our lives generally have secure, long-term deals to stay on board—and our missions are more complex. We are not here to sell Coca-Cola to as many people as possible. We are here for far greater things, we are here l'takken haOlam, to repair the world, we are here to cultivate meaningful relationships with family, with friends, with God; our mission is to build a caring community and to make the world more Godly. Our mission is solitary—each of us has but one life, and that life (the prayers will remind you) is finite. At the same time, our mission is communal—all of our prayers are formed in the 'we', not the 'I'—and much of the meaning in our lives comes from not just our own successes, but of helping those around us lead fulfilling lives. This is going to be one heavy retreat. My image of those corporate retreats includes time in seminars, along with time alone in a contemplative setting. We have our big group gatherings on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, but often the alone time is tough to find. But it's important. I suggest stopping by the shul one day and sitting alone in the sanctuary. Late afternoon has especially nice light—sit alone in the sanctuary and reflect on the great mission of our lives, and how to make the next year better. You can sit in silence, you can page through the lovely Mahzor Lev Shalem for inspiration, you can add some Mozart to an iPod and reflect. You can bring a photo of a loved one who will not be making the journey with you into the new year, and cry for the loss. You can find your own way to make sure this year is lived with purpose, renewed purpose: drawing on old wisdom and new challenges, facing the world as it is and as we want it to be, becoming our best selves.

Employees go on corporate retreats because they're told by the boss. We are commanded by a Higher Authority—The True Chair of the Board—and we are called to a higher purpose than maximizing profits. We are called to maximize human fulfillment, to minimize unnecessary suffering, and we are called to continue the ancient Jewish mission of perfecting the world. It's not an easy task. I look forward to plotting our course ahead, together.

The season is changing and the High Holidays are upon us! We hope that you enjoyed a summer with many memorable experiences and relaxation.

Now, we look inward to reconnect with Our G-d and we look forward to reconnecting with each other in shul. It will be the first time that we, as your co-presidents, will be able to see from the bimah the many faces of our beloved Beth Jacob Congregation. We recognize that you, our family, our neighbours and our friends, are our covenantal partners and our future too and we strive to provide a community in which every individual has the opportunity to grow spiritually, emotionally, intellectually, and socially through various entry points. Clearly the experience of synagogue membership is different for each individual. However, inherent to everyone's affiliation is a connection to the Jewish people. That connection most often involves an active relationship between the individual and the synagogue.

There are opportunities to join in the relationship. Contact any of the following committees: chesed, lottery, religious school, adult education, Out of the Cold, scholar in residence weekend, parent and baby group, etc. We especially welcome our many new members to share their talents and interests with us. You'll quickly feel right at home.

Being the shy, shrinking violet co-presidents that we are, it is sometimes difficult for us to ask congregants to join a committee, sell tickets, organize a dinner. But what is surprising to us is that some people reply, "I would have been involved in the past, but no one ever asked me." So here's your invitation to join with all of the others that already find meaning and satisfaction by involvement.

We must recognize the members of our Board of Governors for their time and energy, always given generously, willingly and with wisdom and insight. We must also applaud the hard work of Donna Shapiro and Wendy Schneider have spent countless hours in Computerland and as a result, they have given us a gift of an improved and user-friendly Beth Jacob web-site, www.bethjacobsynagogue.ca. THE JOY OF YOM KIPPUR


If I asked you what your favourite Jewish holiday was, what would you say? For most kids I talk to, the answer is either Passover or Hanukkah. Purim tends to rank third. For me, it's always been Passover and Yom Kippur. That's right, Yom Kippur. We don't tend to get excited or giddy thinking about Yom Kippur the way we do about other "fun" holidays. But I do and always have. Passover has food. Yom Kippur has no food. Passover has four cups of wine (and more for some). Yom Kippur has none. Passover's theme deals with triumph. Yom Kippur's theme deals with acknowledging faults. Passover brings to mind family and home. Yom Kippur brings to mind synagogue. And these are precisely what makes Yom Kippur so special to me. And the liturgy! The songs! So many! Every year, people come up to me and remark on how impressed they are that I could stand up there so for such a long time. But the truth is that it's not nearly as hard as they think. I'm engrossed in the words of prayer and in the beautiful melodies - ancient and new, Ashkenazi and Sephardi. Make no mistake, it is far from easy and it is exhausting. However, the exhaustion is felt afterwards, not during. I recall growing up at the Spanish & Portuguese Synagogue in Montreal (Canada's first congregation, est. 1768). By mid-afternoon, faces had paled and the sanctuary had virtually emptied. But even as a teen, I and my friends gave it all we had. And then, the greatest moment of the holiday was not Kol Nidrei but the Ne'ilah, the closing service of Yom Kippur. The voices of the entire congregation swelled and filled the hall. As the end neared, the voices grew. The holiday ended on a crescendo - every year. And the climactic moment still comes at the very end with the blowing of the shofar.

Judaism is filled with joy - not a Disney World kind of joy but a real one. Judaism doesn't cower from reality. It faces the flaws of humanity and seeks to find a way to make our world and our lives holy. Yom Kippur captures that notion. The idea that we can find forgiveness is indeed a beautiful one.

We are all tied to our past and we are tied to each other. I invite you to join me in Kol Nidrei and raise your voice in prayer together. May these High Holidays be full of joy, ruach, and song, and may we end them in a crescendo, with a sense of triumph.


